Targets



This half term the children will begin on their "Next Step" targets. All the children will begin with the same target to help them to become familiar with how the system works. Everyone's first target will be to put on their coat independently and to attempt the fastenings [with some adult help if needed].

The target is displayed in a hand shape on your child's section of the learning wall. The idea is for Nursery Staff to colour one of the fingers on the hand each time they observe your child meeting their target. When all five fingers are coloured, your child gets to choose something from "Miss Baynton's Prize Box" and their photo will be taken to mark the occasion on Tapestry.

A letter will be sent home with the next target giving suggestions on how you can support them and help them to practice at home so that they are able to reach their target.
