If your child does not have school snack please could you provide them with a piece of fruit or vegetables to enjoy at snack time.

Reading

Thank you so much for the great effort you put into reading at home last term! Reading is proving to be a great success and it is brilliant to see the children so keen to look at books. Please remember we are aiming for the children to read at home at least 3 times a week.

As the children are beginning to recognise more of the Phase 2 sounds, more of them may begin moving on to Pink books (with words). Please remember it is still just as important for them to talk about the story and understand what is going on, as it is to decode the words.

Outdoor Play

The weather is now turning very cold but in Reception this does not stop us from playing outside. As this is the case please can you ensure that your child has appropriate clothing in school everyday. It would be great if this includes a warm waterproof coat, a cosy hat, a pair of gloves, a scarf and a pair of wellington boots (to keep at school).

Don't forget to label these outdoor clothes with your child's name and class too.

PE

We are continuing with our weekly PE sessions. **Ruby class** will have PE on a Wednesday and **Pearl class** will have PE on a Thursday.

We will be completing our PE sessions outside where possible so please ensure your child has a warm PE kit in school (jogging bottoms and a jumper). Please label all items of your child's PE kit.

Cold Weather

The weather is now turning cold and in line with our schools current risk assessment we need to keep good ventilation in the classroom therefore we will continue to have our windows and one door open at all times. Please can you make sure your child has a jumper or cardigan in school everyday to keep them warm whilst in the classroom.
