Literacy: Newspaper report

What is a newspaper?

Do you know the features of a newspaper? Follow the Literacy video on tapestry to learn about the different features of a newspaper. Then try to label the example newspaper on tapestry with each of the features.



Maths: Statistics

This week and next week we are going to explore statistics through tally charts, pictograms and block diagrams (also known as bar charts). Today you will be investigating Tally Charts. Please watch today's maths lesson video via Tapestry.

Theme: Geography & Science

Today we are going to learn all about weather. Follow the video on tapestry to look at different types of weather. Today you are going to begin a weather diary which you will complete throughout the week. There is a template diary for if you have a printer or you can draw your own. You are then going to create your own weather forecast. You are going to draw or print a map of the UK along with weather symbols. Stick the symbols onto different parts of the UK and then perform your own weather forecast to somebody else in your house. Think carefully about the weather words you use in your forecast. Your forecast does not need to be based on the real weather, it can be any weather you like around the UK. You might want to dress up to suit your weather forecast. For example, if you are predicting snow then you may want to wear a woolly hat and scarf. If you predict a hot sunny day then you may want to perform your forecast in sunglasses and a cap. It would be great if you could film your forecast to put on tapestry too!

Phonics: /oo/

Today we are going to recap all of the different spellings of the oo sound we learnt last week. Follow the phonics video on tapestry and then see if you can sort the words given into the correct column of the table. Can you write a sentence using some of the /oo/ spellings?
