

# Week 3 Monday 18th January:

## Literacy: Biography

This week we are going to create a non-fiction piece of writing which includes facts about somebody we know. We are going to write about somebody who is a hero to us. Think about what the word hero means and what makes someone a hero. You must choose somebody you know in your life (not a character from a book or film); this could be a family member, a friend or somebody else. Discuss with your adult who you are going to choose and why. Today we are going to begin by creating a title for our non-fiction writing, we are going to draw a picture of the person we have chosen and label the features of the person. We are then going to write a caption for the drawing, our caption should include adjectives to describe the person in the drawing. A caption should be short so only write one sentence for this. Please look at the example for ideas.

## Maths: Recognising 3D shapes

## Theme: Science

*An extra challenge: Can you find photos of you as a baby, a toddler and now? Can you order the photos and explain how you have changed?*

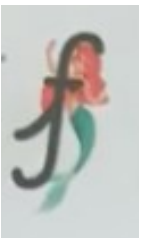
## Handwriting:

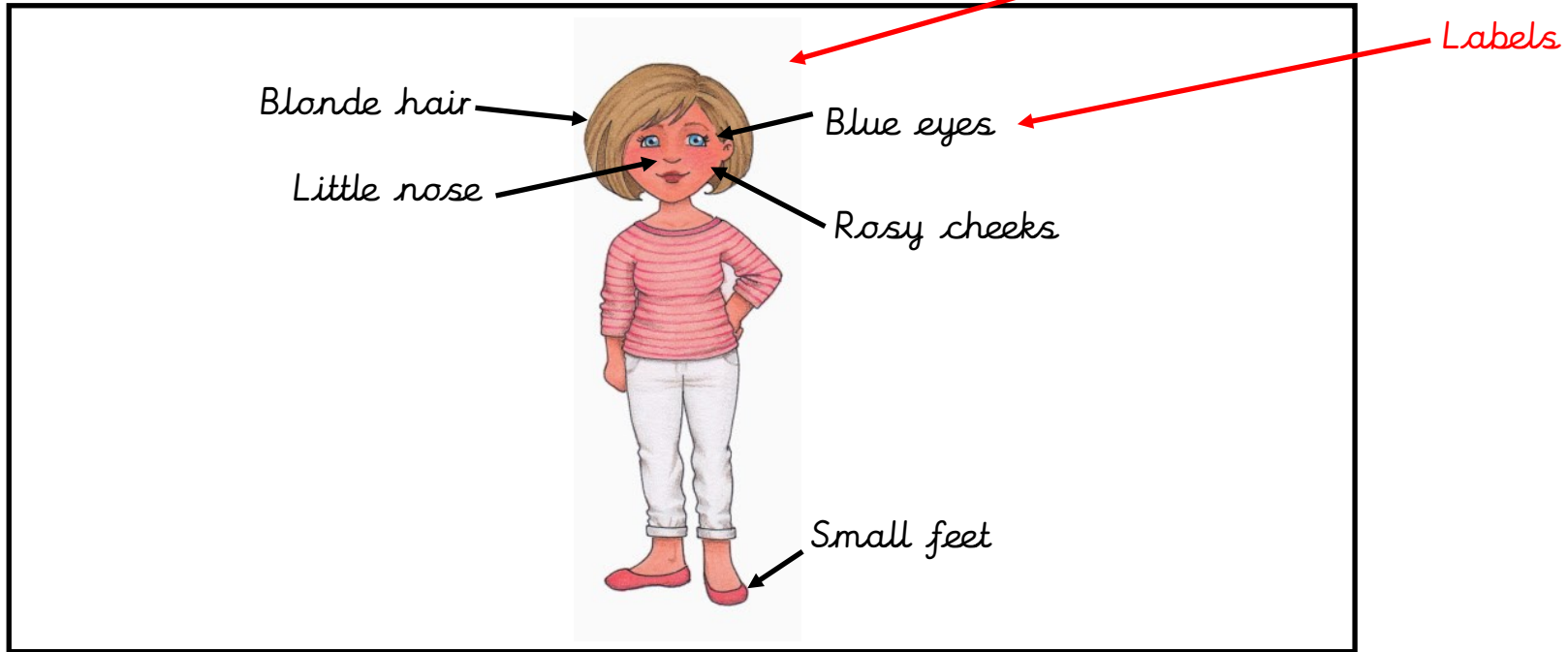
