
Literacy: Biography

Yesterday you started your non-fiction writing all about your real life hero. Today you are going to create an introduction for your writing. The introduction should tell the reader who the person is and describe them. Begin by writing a sub-heading for your introduction. We are then going to focus on using expanded noun phrases. An expanded noun phrase means adding an adjective to a noun phrase. Watch the BBC video link to learn more. Complete sentences that focus on describing your hero; think about the way they look, sound and their personality. Try to start each of your sentences in different ways. Take a look at the example for ideas.


