Literacy: The three little pigs

Listen to the story of 'The three little pigs' on tapestry. Re-watch the video and try to join in with the talk for writing actions. Practise retelling the story lots of times using different voices and in different places of your house remembering to use the actions. Try coming up with your own actions for other parts of the story too. Could you create freeze frames for the key parts of the story?




Maths Activity Resource: Similarities of 2D and 3D shapes



You could print this sheet off or write the answers in your book.

There are 6 square faces on a cube.



What's the same between these two shapes? Think about properties (edges, faces and vertices).





What's the same between these two shapes? Think about properties (sides and corners.)

What's the same between these two shapes? Think about 2D shapes on a 3D shape.


Theme
