RE: *Is religion all around us?*

Remind yourself of our learning from yesterday. Where can we find religion in our local area? Where can we find religion in our school, class room and our homes? Where can we find religion around Norfolk? Where in the world can we see religion? Today we are going to think about prayer. Christians believe that praying to God allows them to say sorry, give thanks and ask for help and strength. What prayers do we say at school each day? What other prayers do you know? What do you think these prayers mean?

Please watch the video on Tapestry to guide you through today's RE learning. Then take a look at today's writing and art activities below:

Writing Activity: We are going to write our own prayer using the characters from Mr Men and Little Miss books to help. Look at the examples as to what each character represents and the type of prayer you could create based on this. Once you have finished writing your prayer, complete the activity writing three things you have learnt this week about our big question.

Art Activity: At the beginning of the week, Miss John set the whole school an RE challenge to create a prayer garden. If you haven't already created one this week, now is your time to do so! You could draw your garden on a piece of paper, you could create it using toys and objects you have in your home, or you could use natural resources from your garden or on your daily walk to make your prayer garden. Don't forget to upload your creations onto tapestry for Miss John to see! Miss John will put a video together of all of the photographs uploaded onto Tapestry for this challenge. We hope you have lots of fun.

Phonics: Recap and compare /oa/ spellings

Sound out and read the following words: coat, snow, toe, bone, both, crow, envelope, croak. Next sound out and read the sentences 'The snowman phones home.' and 'Show me that coat.' Practise reading the tricky words looked, called and asked. Finally, read through 'The old pony' and highlight all graphemes of the 'oa' sound.

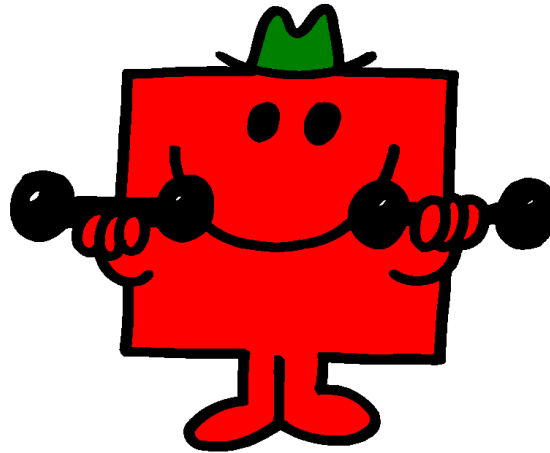

RE - Mr Men and Little Miss characters to inspire prayer writing



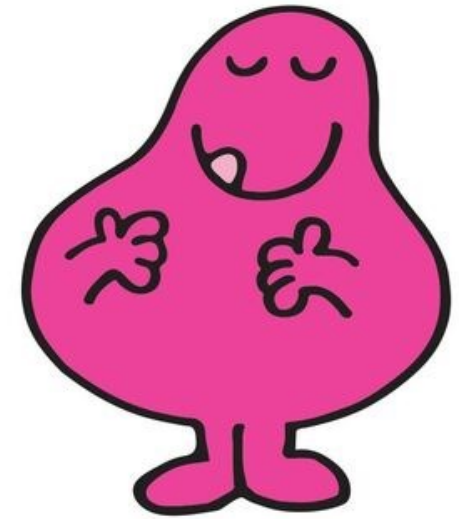
Mr Happy

Mr Happy can inspire us to say thank you to God for something that makes us happy and that we are grateful for. You may want to say thank you for the people around you such as family or friends. You may want to say thank you for people who are working hard to protect you and look after you such as NHS workers.



Mr Strong

Mr Strong can inspire us to write a prayer to God to ask for strength for us or for others. We could ask for the strength to help us or others through a difficult time or when we are feeling weak.



Mr Greedy

Mr Greedy can encourage us to pray to God to say sorry for times that we have been greedy. This might be a time we haven't shared something like a toy or a treat. We can ask God for forgiveness for this.



Little Miss Naughty

Little Miss Naughty can encourage us to apologise to God. We can say sorry for something we have done wrong, something we know was a bad choice. We can ask God for forgiveness for our decisions.



Mr Bump

Mr Bump reminds us of people who are poorly. We could pray to God to ask for God to be with someone we know who is poorly. We could ask God to also be with people we don't know but who are in hospitals poorly.



Little Miss Sunshine

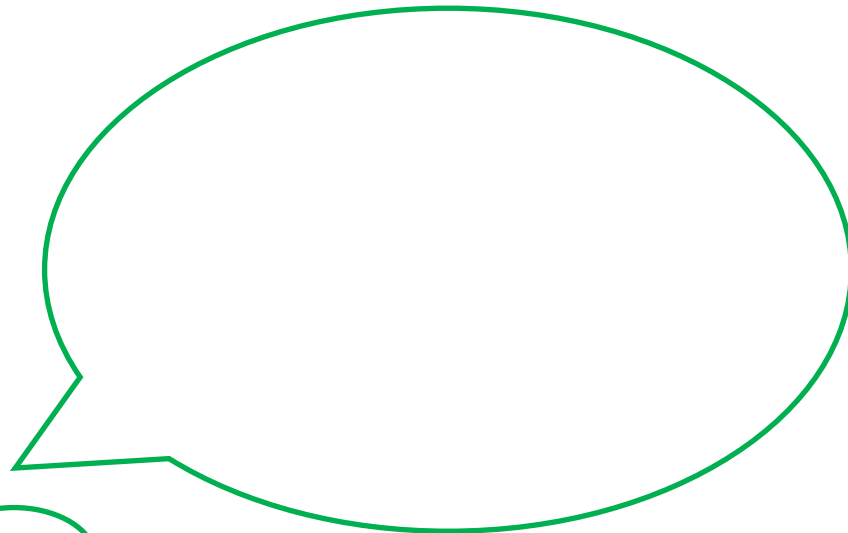
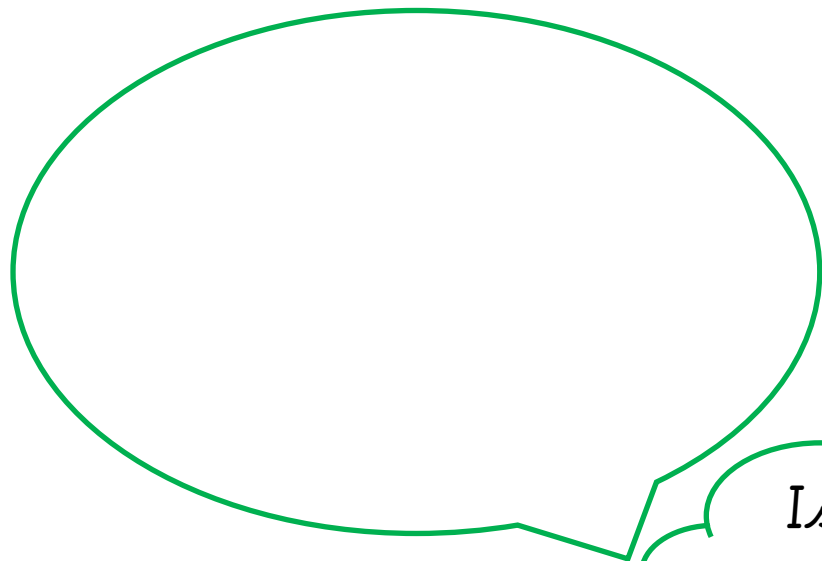
Little Miss Sunshine reminds us to be positive. She could inspire us to write a prayer to thank God for the beautiful things in the world around us.



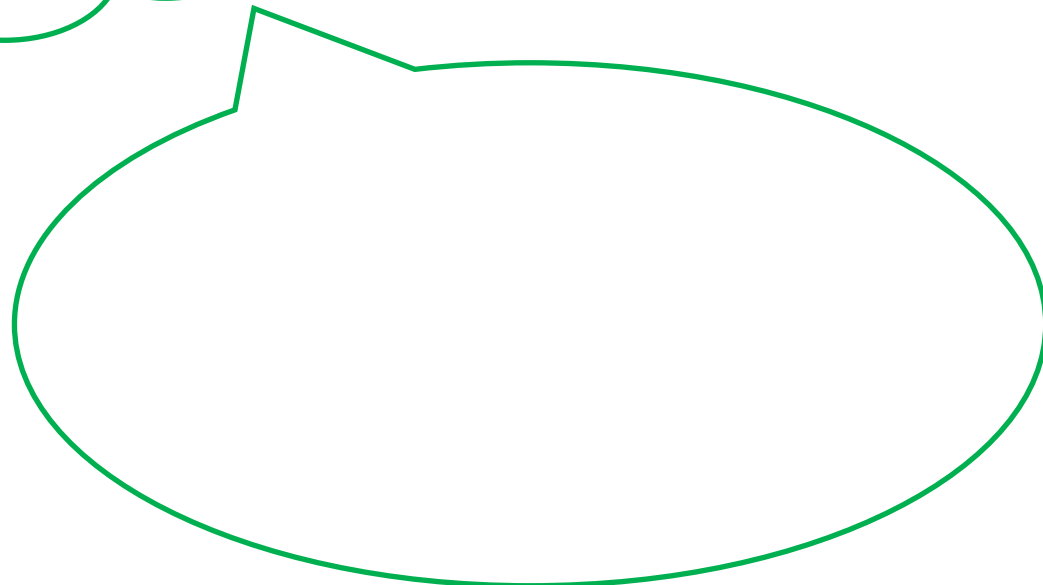
Mr Brave
