8 8 9 8 8 9 8 8 9

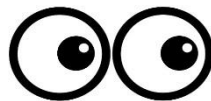

Creative



Can you make some salt dough fossils?

1. Preheat the oven to its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment.
2. Mix 1 cupful of plain flour (about 250g) and half a cupful of table salt (about 125g) in a bowl. Add half a cupful of water (about 125ml) and stir until it comes together into a ball.
3. Move the dough to a floured work surface and shape into a circle. Press a toy dinosaur into the dough to make your fossil design.
4. Put your finished items on the lined baking sheet and bake for 3 hours until solid.
5. Leave to cool.
6. Keep your salt dough fossils for tomorrow's creative activity.
