Vocabulary: Offspring

Watch the Phonics video on Tapestry. Practice writing the grapheme /air/. Remember to join the letters together because it is a trigraph. Can you write the word to match the picture?



Once you have practiced the grapheme, watch the rest of the phonics video and have a go at writing a sentence. Remember that a sentence needs a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.

Choose one of the mammals from below. Can you build its offspring from play-dough or modelling clay?
