Phonics screening

Children usually participate in the phonics screening during Year one. Due to school closure and national lockdowns, the children did not complete their phonics screening last year. This means the children will complete their screening during the Autumn term of Year 2.

What is it?

- *The screening is statutory
- *Tests phonics knowledge
- *40 words; 20 real and 20 pseudo
- *Two sections

What is tested?


- *Segmenting and Blending
- *40+ phonemes
- *Digraphs/trigraphs and their alternatives, e.g. /ai/ ay a_e,

When is it?

The screening will take place during November. It will be 1:1 with your child's class teacher.

After the test...

A letter will be sent home with your child's score and to inform you of the pass score. The letter will provide information to explain how school will support your child further if they did not pass the screening.


