#### Indoor shoes

As the weather gets worse it might be nice to have some indoor shoes to leave at nursery so they can play on the carpet without getting dirty off their outside shoes. These could be whatever they are comfy in... plimsolls, crocs, Velcro slippers!

### Home Learning ideas!

Ask different people in your family what their favourite number rhyme/song is. Can you or an adult draw a picture of the rhyme (e.g. a frog face for "5 little speckled frogs") and put the pictures into a pillow case.

Let your family members take a turn pulling out a picture and help them to sing the number songs..

Can you use any left over materials, like cereal boxes, to make a junk model version of your home?
Who lives in the home?
What do they look like?
How is your family similar to the family that live next door?
How are they different to the family that live next door?

Watch JoJo and GranGran (Episode 10 ]- It's time to look at old photos on BBC iplayer.

What family photos do you have? Look through a family photo album, or maybe make a fresh one with new photos.

Who can you see in the photos? What are they to you? What were you doing in the photo?

Can you take photos of things in your home that are different shapes?

Can you take a good look at yourself in a mirror?

It's time to draw a 'portrait'!

What colour do you need to draw your eyes? How about your hair? What about the grown ups that are special to you? How are they different?

(Grown ups-don't worry too much about the drawing skills... its the conversation about colours/shapes and the decision making that's really important here!)

Can you find any other stories online, at home or at the library about different types of families?
