We would love to see any of your home learning or other exciting things you get up to at home by uploading them to tapestry yourselves.

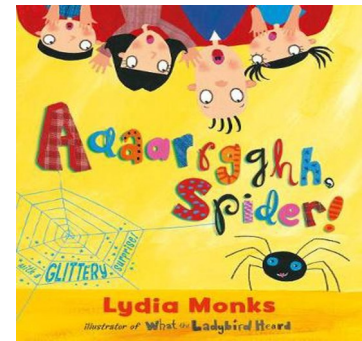


What are we learning in Nursery?
