## 7Cs Assessment

I wanted to provide a little more information about the 7cs assessment that we as a school have adopted as a fair and consistent way to assess and track progress of our learners with SEND.

The 7Cs learning portfolio includes 7 areas all beginning with a C. They are:

1. Cognition
2. Communication
3. Creativity
4. Control
5. Compassion
6. Coordination
7. Curriculum

We use the portfolio to be able to talk about the strengths of your child but also identify three areas for development. Your child's class teacher will then plan targets and provision to support them based on the 7Cs. This allows us to use consistent language throughout our school but also to think beyond the curriculum for our learners with SEND.

## INDES/IPSEF

Norfolk County Council have developed a briefing sheet for parents/carers providing information regarding two tools they have developed. The tools are used in mainstream settings to support their provision for children with SEND.

The tools are:

- Identification of needs descriptors in educational settings (INDES)
- An Inclusion and Provision Self-Evaluation Framework (IPSEF)

The briefing sheet explains what these tools are, why they are useful and how they will be used in school.

## At DCINA

### SEND Library Bus Session - Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> January - DCINA - 8:50-9:00

This bus session will be quieter and at a reduced capacity compared to our regular Thursday after school bus sessions. Your child will go into class at the normal time to be registered. It will be held in the hall and there will be lights, bubbles and sensory equipment to touch, feel and play with.

### SEND Parent Coffee Morning - Friday 6th March - DCINA - 11-12 - Free

This event is for adults/carers of children with SEND or emerging needs. Pop along for a tea/coffee and some biscuits where we can sit, talk and share advise with one another.

## Local community

### Making Sense of SEND - Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2026 - Dereham Memorial Hall - 10-3 - Free

Making Sense of SEND is a free event for parents/carers who have a child with SEND. It is a free information fair where you can meet the people behind certain SEND services. You'll have the opportunity to go around, find out more and ask questions. Free refreshments are provided.



### SEND Cafes - Every Monday - Dereham Library - 1:30-2:30 - Free

A weekly SEND cafe for families with children with special educational needs or disabilities to meet, share ideas and gain professional information, advice and guidance. You do not need to book, just turn up when you can.

### Autism Explorers Sensory Saturdays - Every Saturday - The Jubilee Community Centre, NR1 2EX - 9:45-12:00

Every Saturday Autism Explorers hold a Sensory session for children aged from birth to 12. These sessions are themed, sensory, child led play with arts and crafts, movement and more!

Sessions cost £4.50 for a full session or £3.00 for a hour. The price is per child but adults and children under 1 are free.
