What to bring to Nursery?

Please ensure your child brings a coat to Nursery everyday, we go out in all weathers!

Wellies can be left at Nursery on the wall mounted welly pegs to keep their feet dry!

The children should bring in a named drink bottle containing **ONLY plain tap water** each day— these can be left on the lunch box trolley.

It is always useful to have a spare set of clothes at Nursery in case of accidents or messy play mishaps. These can be left on their peg.

Please bring a bookbag for letters and artwork.

Lunches- Please ensure you follow the school lunch-box policy. We are nut free school. Please ensure your child's lunch contains some fruit and or vegetables and has only 1 type of sweet treat (cake/biscuit) Sweets and chocolate bars are not permitted in school lunches or snacks.

Morning snack is provided by Nursery but you can send your child a fruit or vegetable based snack if they prefer this. In the afternoon they either eat something they have left in their lunchbox or a biscuit provided by us..



Jobs


